

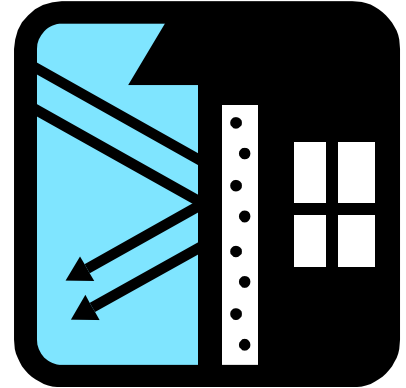


Weatherization & Building Maintenance Technician

Program Description:

This course will provide basic instruction and training for students looking to enter entry-level positions, such as crew member or facility maintenance technician, in the Weatherization field.

Students will understand weatherization analysis, assess building performance, remediate and execute job site repairs and improvements to maximize building efficiency. Students will also learn building anatomy and structural standards. Using hands-on techniques, classroom lecture, and textbook instruction, this course will enable students to develop or improve their skills as a residential maintenance technician-including, but not limited to, apartments, condominiums and small businesses.
