Group Author	Spell out the full name. Follow with a period.	Royal Institute of Technology. National Institute of Mental Health.
No Author	Move title to the author position, before the date of publication. A period follows the title.	
Editors	Enclose the abbreviation Ed. or Eds. In parentheses after the last editor's name. A period follows the parentheses.	Editor, A. A. (Ed.). Editor, A. A., Editor, B. B., & Editor, C. C. (Eds.).
No Date Given	Use n.d.	Author, A. A. (n.d.)
Publication Information	Give the city and state (US Postal Abbreviations) or city and country separated by a comma, followed by a colon. Give the name of the publisher is as brief a form as intelligible. Omit terms such as <i>Publishers, Co.,</i> and <i>Inc.</i> Retain words such as <i>Books</i> and <i>Press</i> . Use <i>Author</i> when the group author is also the publisher.	New York, NY: McGraw-Hill. Newbury Park, CA: Sage. Pretoria, South Africa: Unisa. Washington, DC: Author.

CITING APA REFERENCES IN-TEXT

APA Style uses the author-date citation system. This system allows readers to find the sources cited in text in the reference list, where each source is listed alphabetically.

To insert a citation in text, include the author's surname and year of publication. For a direct quotation, include the page number or specific location of the phrase or sentences in the original work.

Author and Date Cited in Text (no parenthetical citation necessary)	In a 1989 article, Gould explores some of Darwin's most effective metaphors.
Author Not Cited in Text	As metaphors for the workings of nature, Darwin used the tangled bank, the tree of life, and the face of nature (Gould, 1989).
Author Cited in Text	Gould (1989) attributes Darwin's success to his gift for making the appropriate metaphor.
Direct Quotation with Name of Author	Gould (1989) explains that Darwin used the metaphor of the tree of life "to express the other form of interconnectedness—genealogical rather than ecological—and to illustrate both success and failure in the history of life" (p. 14).
Direct Quotation without Name of Author	Darwin used the metaphor of the tree of life "to express the other form of interconnectedness—genealogical rather than ecological" (Gould, 1989, p. 14).

For each of the samples above the correct APA style format for the reference list would be:

Gould, S. J. (1989). The wheel of fortune and the wedge of progress. *Natural History*, 89(3), 14-21.

When you need to cite two or more works together, arrange the in-text citations alphabetically in the same order in which they appear in the reference list.

Here are some examples of citations that include more than one work in the same parenthesis:

Training materials are available (Department of Veterans Affairs, 2001, 2003)
Past research (Gogel, 1990, 2006)
Several studies (Derryberry & Reed, 2005a, 2005b; Rothbart, 2003a, 2003b)
Several studies (Miller, 1999; Shafranske & Mahoney, 1998)
