

To access *American History in Video* go to www.cfcc.edu/lrc, under *Research Tools* click on *Articles & eResources*, then choose *American History in Video*.

If you are off campus you will be prompted for your *CFCC Username/Password*.

To begin your research, you have multiple options: *Browse*, browse by *Historical Eras* or *Search*.

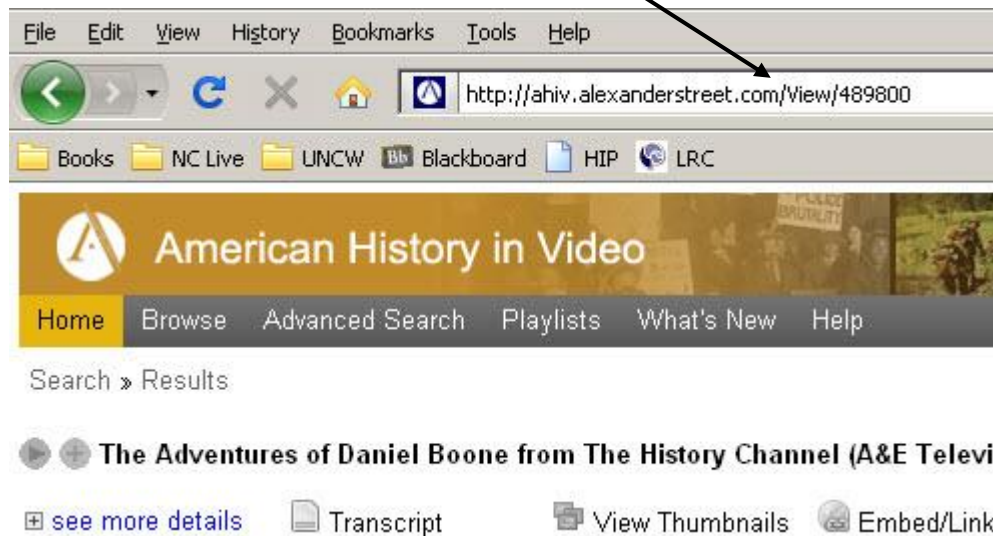

After the **.com** add the Ezproxy URL: .ezproxy.cfcc.edu



***** Off Campus:** The Ezproxy URL is automatically added to the article bookmark URL.
