

## How Scholarly Is This Book ?

		How can this be checked?
△	Is the original editor of the book now a part of the book's title?	
△	Is the author well known in his or her field?	
△	Have many other books or journal articles cited this book?	
△	How many libraries own this book? Which libraries own it?	
△	Is there a review of the book that discusses the author(s) credentials?	
△	Was the book positively reviewed? Where?	
△	Is the editor of the book named (rather than, or in addition to, the author)?	
△	Is this edition of the book higher than 1 <sup>st</sup> ; how many editions have there been?	
△	Does the book have bibliographical references?	
△	Does the book have an index?	
▽	Are there Library of Congress subject headings for the book containing "Juvenile literature" or "Popular works?"	

There are two types of "books" that may not have this type of information available but that may be considered authoritative: documents published by government agencies (U.S. Fire Safety Administration) or by national associations (American Dental Association).
