

## BLET Sponsorships (Current Until 6/30/2026)

Some Cape Fear Community College Basic Law Enforcement Training (BLET) students are <u>sponsored</u> by a North Carolina municipal, county or state law enforcement agency. The agency is not obligated to hire the student, and a student does not have to take a job with the sponsoring agency. Sponsorship is not required to be enrolled. Students may enroll and pay for BLET on their own. However, all requirements set forth by the North Carolina Criminal Justice Standards & Training Commission must be met prior to attendance.

Students interested in being sponsored must contact law enforcement agencies and ask if they provide sponsorships for training. Agencies will conduct background checks, and if there are no problems, they will notify the student and the Cape Fear Community College BLET School Director that they plan to provide sponsorship. Upon receiving sponsorship, tuition is waived for attending BLET. However, the student will be responsible for the BLET Student Activity Fee, uniforms, required textbooks, and any other costs associated with the application process.

Students in the BLET program will <u>not</u> be eligible for Pell grants. Students are eligible for VA assistance. Students are strongly encouraged to seek assistance with funding. To see if you qualify for other forms of financial assistance, contact the Cape Fear Community College Offices of <u>Financial Aid</u> and <u>Veterans Services</u>.
