PRESENTATION – 2019 Year in Review

Mr. Morton presented a 2019 Year in Review PowerPoint Presentation for the Board of Trustees.

Ms. David read the following statement:

Cape Fear Community College is moving in a positive direction. The College has had a dramatic increase in enrollment. The College is offering new programs in cutting-edge areas to benefit the career prospects of our students. There also are improved pathways to matriculate into four-year degree programs at universities in our state. Our connections with the business community have never been stronger.

The Board of Trustees has confidence in the leadership team for the College. There also has been an outpouring of support for College administration from faculty and staff since two former employees voiced their complaints in the media.

No current employee has submitted any work environment complaint or any complaint about the President through the policies or procedures outline in the CFCC Faculty & Staff Handbook. Cape Fear Community College takes all employee complaints seriously. If any current employee has a concern, the current employee should follow the process in the CFCC Faculty & Staff Handbook.

Mr. Hopkins stated that he has had the pleasure of serving on the board for two terms. He stated that he has never had a time when he has been prouder than to serve with Jim Morton.

Ms. Rouse stated that the President has the respect for the board and is doing great things for the College.

Bill Cherry echoed the sentiments of the other board members.

Ms. Kusek stated that she was one of the biggest supporters of President Morton and that this community has every reason to be proud of the accomplishments of the College. She stated that President Morton is doing the job that the board hired him to do. Facilitating change is hard and some people will always be resistant to change. She also stated that there is one media network and one reporter that have shown a great lack of professionalism and respect in the way that they have reported this story.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

President Morton reviewed the following report.

<u>CFCC Associate Degree in Nursing Program Ranked #1 in North Carolina for 2020</u> - The Cape Fear Community College Associate Degree Nursing (ADN) program has been ranked number one in the NursingProcess.org Best Schools in North Carolina for Registered Nursing (ADN/ASN) Programs - 2020 rankings list.

<u>Apple</u> – Attended meeting with Apple representatives and other NHC government and educational leaders in California on January 13-14, 2020.

<u>Program Closing</u> –Industrial Systems Technology has had declining enrollment. Local and regional industries are shifting their site engineering and technical maintenance requirements to more of a focus on mechatronics. CFCC's Mechatronics Engineering Program can respond to this shift in industry requirements.

A MOTION was made by Mr. Collins and seconded by Mr. Melia to close the Industrial Systems Technology Program due to low enrollment. Motion carried unanimously.

<u>NCCCS</u> – Vice President John Downing was announced as a finalist for the NCCCS Staff of the Year. John was named in the top 3 of 40 applicants.

CFCC Interior Design Students Partner with Welcome Home Angel for Unique Design Project – CFCC students Tess Luman, Brianna Lovins, and Kara Kube worked on an unforgettable project this fall. The trio responded to a request for help from Welcome Home Angel. The group works to design healthy and cheerful spaces within clients' existing homes in which the children can live and recover. CFCC Interior Design Program Director Tammy Powell presented the students the opportunity to work on this unique project. An eight-year-old boy with neuromuscular disease had just relocated to a new home. The new home had a sunroom, but it needed to be designed for the child's specific needs. The three students readily agreed to work on the project together, outside of their class assignments.

Cape Fear Community College to Host 180 Eighth Graders for a Science and Mystery Filled Day Cape Fear Community College will host the entire eighth grade class of Topsail Middle School on Friday, February 28, at its North Campus during EASE (Effective and Authentic Science Events), a STEM outreach initiative. EASE is sponsored by NC Community Colleges and BioNetwork.
