Lead Paint Removal Grant

CFCC has been awarded \$67,120 from the City of Wilmington and the US Department of Housing and Urban Development, to provide lead-based paint awareness and education programs, informing best work practices to local volunteers and contractors. This is part of the Lead Hazard Reduction/Healthy Homes Program. CFCC hopes to start the program in mid to late Spring. CFCC will offer several classes, and the entire program will span 18 months.

Dorothy Gillespie Exhibition

The Wilson Center and the Wilma W. Daniels Art Gallery are presenting an exhibition - Dorothy Gillespie: Selected Works from the Radford University Collection, which opened on Friday, January 15th, and will run through February 26, 2021.

Gillespie was a groundbreaking New York artist from the mid-1940s up until her death in 2012. She forged a career that was truly independent and innovative, and helped blaze a path for women artists during the feminist art movement of the 1970s. Gillespie was a master of many media, including paint, paper, sculpture, printmaking, environments and happenings, ceramics, jewelry, and even set design. A MOTION from the Finance Committee recommends to the Board of Trustees approval by the Board of Trustees of the State Budget Revision for a decrease of \$107,414.00. Motion carried unanimously.

State Budget Summary

The State Budget Summary reported 47.01 percent of the budget had been expended as of December 2020.

President Morton reported that the College will received the next round of CARES Funding of over \$9 million. The budget callback from the State was approximately 1 percent not the 2 percent previously held.

County Budget Summary

The County Budget Summary reported 45.13 percent of the budget had been expended as of December 2020.

Institutional Funds Update

Mr. Morton reviewed the December, 2020 report. No items were of concern at this time.

Wilson Center Quarterly Report

President Morton reviewed the Wilson Center Quarterly Report. No items were of concern.

Foundation Fundraising Goals

President Morton reviewed the Foundation fundraising goals. The Foundation has surpassed their yearly goals by over 103 percent as of December 2020.

ADMINISTRATIVE & PERSONNEL COMMITTEE

Salary Increases

President Morton made the following statement:

I am very proud to have served in the capacity of President of Cape Fear Community College for the past 3 years. Enrollment had been decreasing for many years when I accepted the position. Budgetary issues had to be addressed before salary increases could be considered.

I have asked a tremendous amount from our employees, and their hard work has produced consecutive enrollment increases. It is hard to articulate the many challenges this involved including hurricanes and a global pandemic. Fortunately, I have a great team of faculty and staff that work very hard every day to adjust to changing circumstances. They have all stepped up in a major way.

Many colleges decided to give a bonus to employees in the fall. I did not do this because I felt the State would ease budgetary restrictions, and instead of a one-time bonus, I wanted to give a permanent salary increase to our full-time employees. Today, I am authorizing a 2 percent increase for all full-time employees effective February 1, 2021. It has been a long time coming and I want to sincerely thank everyone for their efforts and dedication.

A MOTION was made by Mr. Cherry and seconded by Ms. Rouse to adopt a resolution to support President Morton in awarding all full-time faculty and staff employed on February 1, 2021, a 2 percent salary increase. Motion carried unanimously.

A MOTION was made by Mr. Collins and seconded by Mr. McLeod to go into closed session pursuant to North Carolina General Statute Section 143-318.11(a)(6) to discuss personnel. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board returned to open session.

A MOTION was made by Mr. Burney and seconded by Ms. Sewell to approve a salary increase for President Morton of \$26,000 per year. Motion carried unanimously. The Board thanked President Morton for his performance and leadership.

SGA REPORT

No report.

FACULTY ASSOCIATION REPORT

Dr. Brandon reviewed the following report and thanked President Morton for his work in increasing salaries.

The Faculty Association held its third regular meeting of the Fall 2020 semester on December 2, 2020. A number of topics were discussed, including the possibility of an employee bonus to reward the hard work of CFCC employees during the pandemic. This was a virtual meeting. Approximately twenty-five faculty members were in attendance. The Faculty Association will continue with virtual meetings in the Spring 2021 semester.

The Faculty Association Officers continued the regularly scheduled meetings with the CFCC Executive Team. At the December 11, 2020 meeting, a variety of topics were discussed, including the possibility of an employee bonus.

The Faculty Association re-opened the 2020 Faculty Climate Survey for a few more weeks in December as a way to increase participation. The Faculty Association Officers are currently tabulating the data from the survey.

The Faculty Association Committee on Part-Time Pay Rates at CFCC was established. The aim of this committee is to research the issues around part-time pay rates at CFCC and make a proposal to college leadership that attempts to improve both equity and overall levels of compensation for adjuncts and those faculty members who are teaching overload contracts.

FOUNDATION REPORT

Mr. Fernando presented the following report.

- This year's YTD revenue is 103 percent ahead of last year's YTD funds with revenue of \$1,325,589.71 (FY 21) over \$652,992.24 (FY 20). We have surpassed last year's entire revenue at this point by \$410,137.80, and have surpassed this year's overall fundraising goal by over \$50,000.
- Even with current fundraising success, there is much more work to do to meet the growing needs of our students at this difficult time. We continue to assess our current programs and remain vigilant to develop new ways to meet student needs.
- The Holiday Helpers program in 2020 had its highest fundraising year ever, raising over \$21,855. Thank you to Betsy Leonard for her leadership and generosity.
- Our End of Year Appeal saw a 66% increase over last year's appeal: 2020 \$37,800.00; 2019 \$22,725. I would like to recognize Logan Thompson for her role in redesigning the appeal, creating a much more focused strategy.
- Close to \$40,000 of gifts of stock were donated in December.
- We are in the process of re-designing our web presence to become more student and donor friendly.
- We are in the planning phase of an outreach, fundraising event for the Burgaw programs this fall.
- We are underway with a space and program audit for large naming opportunities from all CFCC locations. Recommendations will be presented to the trustees shortly so that we will have a bank of naming opportunities ready for potential donors.
