

CFCC LPN-RN Nursing Entrance Examination

Applicants who meet the minimum application requirements will be prompted to schedule the CFCC LPN-RN Nursing Entrance exam following the successful completion of their “Intent to Apply”. Instructions on how to schedule this test will be included in the e-mail to those students whose Intent to Apply meets eligibility requirements. Potential applicants to the LPN to RN Program may take the exam ONCE per application period.

In order to be considered a qualified applicant to the LPN to RN program, a student must meet the minimum score requirements on the CFCC Nursing Entrance exam of 80%. Students will receive the test results via their CFCC email account. If students have met the minimum scores of 80%, they will be invited to attend the Nursing Skills Assessment.

About the Exam:

The CFCC LPN-RN Nursing Entrance examination includes content to meet basic psychological and physiological needs of patients. The nursing process (assessing, analyzing, planning, implementing and evaluating) is used as the framework for the questions and the examination reflects current practice for providing care for patients in various clinical settings.

100 test items will encompass clients in healthcare settings who have common health problems including but not limited to one or more of the following conditions:

2.5 hours is allotted to take the examination. The types of questions that may be administered include multiple-choice; fill-in-the-blank; multiple response; image (hot spot) questions; figure, chart/exhibit, or graphic option items (reviewing NCLEX study guides will provide a description of each type of question)

How to Prepare:

There is no specific review guide for this exam; however, the Nursing Department recommends preparation through the use of LPN course books and NCLEX-PN study guides. Additionally, review of the following topics would assist in preparation for the exam:

Physiologic Needs - Hygiene, Posture, Sleep, Nutrition, Weight, Elimination

Psychosocial Needs - Sexuality, Self-esteem, Belonging, Self-actualization, Security

Communication - Verbal, non-verbal exchanges, documentation

Medication Administration – Medication administration techniques and mathematical conversions for medication dosing

Pharmacology-Medication administration of current medications to include nursing implications

Moral, Ethical, and Legal Issues - Advance directives, informed consent, negligence
